Before the lift could be reopened, he had to find and modify some appropriately sized pipe to replace the irreparable guidage support tubes as well as verify the correct tension and alignment of the newly repaired terminal. In just a few short hours, Lawson was able to make repairs and reopen the lift for our guests.
